Vehicles involved in the Trunk or Treat would be parked on both sides of the closed off portion of School Street.

Kids have access to the playground and the event is centrally located in town for the convenience of participants (rather than having to travel out to the American Legion Post).

Park Street would become temporarily two way with no parking on the street, or perhaps parallel parking on the south side.
